We have a fantastic range of events and activities on offer for all ages, so there's something for everyone to enjoy. This handy guide is your gateway to a world of artistic experiences. Whether you're an art aficionado, a theatre enthusiast, or simply seeking a fun-filled day out with the family, The Atkinson has something to ignite your imagination and inspire your creativity.

The Story So Far

27 May 2023 – 2 March 2024

Looking at the theme of storytelling, this exhibition includes highlights from The Atkinson's and the Harris Art Gallery's collections of narrative paintings. Featuring post-war and contemporary works of art, showcasing the galleries' evolving strategies for developing the narrative theme.

Quilt | Grid | Pattern

16 September 2023 – 24 February 2024

Contemporary artists Christopher Harris and Kevin Laycock respond to the abstract and geometric design qualities found in late 19th century British quilts and the intricate structures found within them.

Suhail Shaikh: Paper My Wishes

25 November 2023 – 24 February 2024

A retrospective of multidimensional artworks made from paper. Central to the exhibition is a true to scale sculpture of the front section of a Lancaster Bomber titled 'The Many'. The cardboard structure is covered in military ephemera donated by veterans and their families, and rests on a bed of poppies created by the local community.

The Landing: Sefton Artists

2 December 2023 – 20 January 2024

A selection of paintings from the local artist group, from traditional landscapes to abstract and experimental work each brimming with passion, talent, and unique perspectives. Artworks are available to purchase.

This exhibition takes you into the home of a remarkable couple (one a Scot, the other a Sandgrounder) whose careers were in the arts, and where the milestones of their lives are mirrored in the artworks they display which embody their shared passion for art.

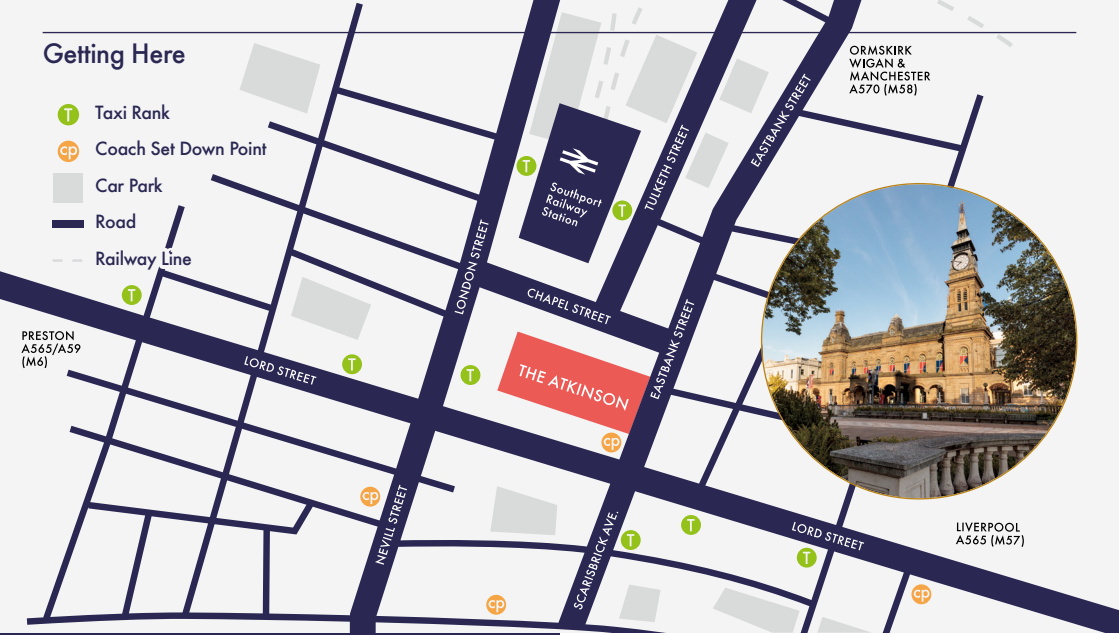
Southport Photographic Society: Open & Members' Exhibition 2024
